It is **your organization** which should submit an application for funding and select the participants to attend our course. One month before the beginning of the course we will confirm the reservation on the basis of a bilateral agreement.

Helpful information about Erasmus + KA1/ Guidelines



The new EU Erasmus+ Programme provides funding opportunities for further education (adult training) for educational professionals of each field with a special focus on organisational capacity.

What Erasmus+ is:

Great opportunities for professional development of professionals Erasmus+ (and specifically the so-called Key Action 1) offers grants for professional development of staff of school, adult and higher education, as well as Youth organisations (formal or informal). This means that organisations can apply for a grant to cover preparation, travel, course fees and accommodation of staff abroad.

Who is eligible?

Participating eligible organisations can be:

- any public or private organisation active in the field of adult education (defined as adult education organisation)

or

- any public or private organisation active in the labour market or in the fields of education, training and youth.

For example, such organisations can be:

- an adult education school/institute/centre;
- an establishment for adult learners with special needs;
- a higher education institution (including those providing educational opportunities for adults);
- a public or private, a small, medium or large enterprise (including social enterprises);
- a social partner or other representative of working life, including chambers of commerce, craft/professional associations and trade unions;
- a public body at local, regional or national level;
- a research institute;
- a foundation;
- a school/institute/educational centre;
- a non-profit organisation, association, NGO;
- a cultural organisation, library, museum;
- a body providing career guidance, professional counselling and information services.

Each organisation must be established in a Programme Country (all EU countries, Liechtenstein, Norway, Turkey, Iceland, FYROM or Switzerland).

Eligible participants can be staff members of the above organisations (including registered volunteers)

Aims

The Actions supported under Key Action 1 are expected to produce positive and long-lasting effects on the participants and participating organizations involved, as well as on the policy systems in which such activities are framed.

Erasmus+ supports learning mobility of staff that:

- is framed into a strategic approach of the participating organisations (aimed at modernising and internationalising their mission)
- responds to clearly identified staff development needs and is accompanied by appropriate selection, preparation and follow-up measures
- ensures that the learning outcomes of participating staff are properly recognised, disseminated and widely used within the organization.

How to register to Erasmus+ and apply for funding

The processes of registration and application for a grant consists of the following steps:

1. Find your National Agency [here](#). This is where you will apply for the funding. The conditions for participation depend on the country in which you are based. Therefore please contact your National Agencies and check its website.
2. If you are not already registered, register your organisation on the [European Commission Authentication Service \(ECAS\)](#), registered. Log in to the [Participant Portal with your ECAS account details and register your organisation on the Unique Registration Facility \(URF\)](#) to obtain your unique Participant Identification Code (PIC), if you are not already registered. The European Commission has produced a [Participant Portal User Manual](#) to guide you through the portal registration process.
3. Download the application form at the website of your National Agency [here](#). Fill it in and submit it according to its instructions respecting the **deadline of 04th of March 2015, 12.00 C.E.T.**
4. Inform us as soon as you have news about your grant.
